

# 12 Tenses: Simple Sentence Structures

## PRESENT TENSES

“I am in \_\_\_\_\_.”

“Who is in \_\_\_\_\_?”

“I’m going to \_\_\_\_\_.”

“Who’s going to \_\_\_\_\_?”

“I have been to \_\_\_\_\_.”

“Who has been to \_\_\_\_\_?”

“I have been living in/near \_\_\_\_\_ since 2015.”

“Who has been living in/near \_\_\_\_\_ for at least five years?”

## PAST TENSES

“I went to \_\_\_\_\_ last year.”

“Who went to \_\_\_\_\_ last year?”

“I was watching a program about \_\_\_\_\_ until midnight.”

“Who was watching a program about \_\_\_\_\_ until midnight?”

“I had already seen \_\_\_\_\_ when I went there with my friends.”

“Who had already seen \_\_\_\_\_ when they went there with their friends?”

“I had been living in/near \_\_\_\_\_ until 2019.”

“Who had been living in/near \_\_\_\_\_ until last year?”

## FUTURE TENSES

“I will be in \_\_\_\_\_ next week.”

“Who will be in \_\_\_\_\_ next week?”

“I will be traveling to \_\_\_\_\_ by next Tuesday.”

“Who will be traveling to \_\_\_\_\_ by the weekend?”

“I will already have been to \_\_\_\_\_ by next weekend.”

“Who will already have been to \_\_\_\_\_ by next Sunday?”

“I will have been studying in/near \_\_\_\_\_ for two months by the time you arrive.”

“Who will have been studying in/near \_\_\_\_\_ for a few weeks by the time I arrive?”
